


Lake Texoma Trivia

Fishing report from TPWD.

GOOD. Water lightly stained; 86-89 degrees; 0.46 feet high. Striped bass are good on live bait along the river channel with some top water action at sunrise. White bass are good on silver slabs and white swimbaits. Largemouth bass are good fishing flukes, shaky head jigs, crankbaits and Texas rigged plastic worms. Crappie are good on minnows and jigs near boat-houses, timber near a channel and brush piles. Catfish are good on earthworms, chicken liver and live bait.

Time to Start Thinking About Winterization!

Heat indexes may be high right now, but believe it or not it's time to start thinking about scheduling the winterization of your boat as fall fast approaches! Before the mercury dips below freezing, you need to prepare your boat for the coming winter. Fresh water expansion can crack an engine block, damage fiberglass, split hoses, or destroy a refrigeration system overnight.
